

STAR-SPANGLED CLEANUP

The Mississippi Coastal Cleanup Program held their annual Star-Spangled Cleanup on July 6th to target cleaning up the from the Fourth of July festivities.

We had an amazing turnout with **270 volunteers** who cleaned up a collective **3,000 lbs of trash** off the beaches of Coastal Mississippi.



BARRIER ISLAND CLEANUP INITIATIVE

The Barrier Island Cleanup Initiative has also had a successful launch and summer, **completing 4 clean ups on Cat, Horn, and Petit Bois islands**. In total, the team along with the amazing volunteers that have come out to support have cleaned 1,195 pounds of trash from our barrier island beaches! A huge thank you to our charter captains and volunteers for generously dedicating their time and resources to make this initiative a success!

COMMITTEE MEETING UPDATES

MSEP had our second round of meetings with the Science, Engagement, and Civil committees to begin the process of laying out action items for the comprehensive conservation and management plan (CCMP). Our committees made great progress and MSEP staff have started to draft the action item templates that will go into our CCMP. Our fall committee meetings are around the corner where we will continue to work on the CCMP to make sure all priority topics are covered!

1ST ANNUAL TEACHER WORKSHOP

MSEP co-hosted its first annual teacher workshop at the MSU Coastal Research and Extension Center back in June. The goal of the workshop was to provide regional high school age science teachers with working knowledge of our estuary, issues facing the coast, and ways to engage students in learning about our natural resources and climate resilience.

We had 10 teachers from across the Coast for the two day workshop where they learned about sustainability, resilience, and topics like estuary conservation and living shoreline restoration.

They also got to participate in an island cleanup and see some of the living shoreline restoration efforts in Back Bay. We look forward to supporting our teachers throughout the year with our many education and outreach programs and hosting a new cohort of teachers at the next workshop on June 17- 19, 2025!




